## MISSION OF THE MONTH

### Second Harvest Food Bank

Since 1986 Second Harvest Foodbank of Southern Wisconsin has put more than 100 million meals on the tables of our neighbors who are facing hunger in southwestern Wisconsin. It is through partnerships and collaboration that we are able to meet the nutritional needs of our neighbors facing hunger. Additionally, as part of the food system, we are able to reduce waste by connecting with food-related businesses and farmers.

- **Food Acquisition and Storage**

Each year we acquire and store millions of pounds of food from a variety of sources including local and regional farmers, food manufacturers, and grocers which allows us to reduce food waste and provide nutritious food to our community.

- **Food Distribution**

Through our powerful network of over 300 partner agencies and programs, we distribute more than 20 million pounds of food throughout 16 southwestern Wisconsin counties every year.

- **FoodShare Outreach**

FoodShare is a federally funded program. Our team of FoodShare Outreach Specialists provides assistance to the community with applying for this benefit. FoodShare helps stretch your budget by depositing money on a debit-like card once per month to help buy groceries.

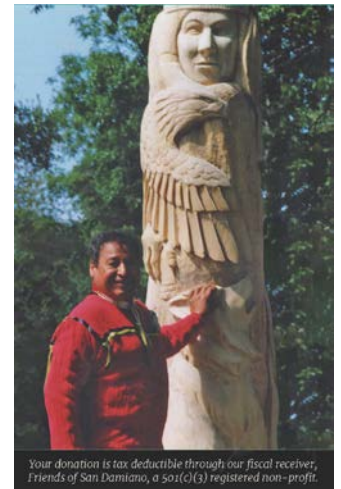
**Location:** The festival will be held at scenic San Damiano Park

## JAVA JIVE

Support farmers in Burkina Faso

Gebana, our primary trade partner for cashews and mangoes in Burkina Faso, is one of the largest alternative traders in the world, consistently taking risks to support small farmers and help them gain access and control in the global market.

The company sells its partners' products in bulk directly to consumers through its online shop, as well as to retailers in Europe, Asia, and the U.S. through a Dutch subsidiary. Today, Gebana buys directly from almost 12,000 farming families and employs 850 people worldwide, 96% of whom work in countries of the global South.

Founded in 2009, Gebana Burkina Faso has played a major role in transforming local agricultural production and contributing to strengthening the network of small family farmers. In 2023, Gebana Burkina Faso produced 1050 tons of dried mango and 405 tons of cashew nuts, making the company a major player in the agricultural food industry in West Africa.

By processing in-country, we are helping to develop local economies and create jobs.

The money that gets generated through workers' salaries creates further investment. The higher prices we pay for products, together with the premiums, further supports entire communities.

The factory we are currently building will be the biggest capacity of any other processing factory in Burkina Faso. When completed, it will be an investment of over \$12 million. All in all, we are projecting to create 1000 additional jobs and to incorporate 4000 more organic family farmers into the network.

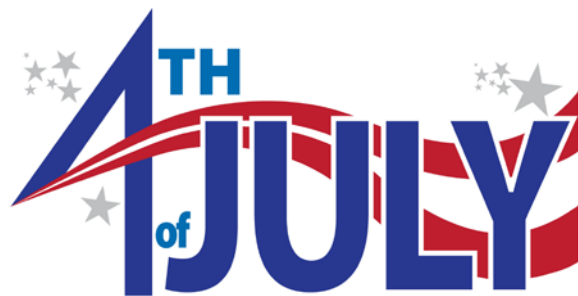

## ...FOR THE LOVE OF GOD'S CREATION...

... with eyes on upcoming elections, the **Wisdom Action Network is encouraging us to consider the RIGHTS OF NATURE** along with other social justice issues that weigh heavy on our hearts.

*Among the many important matters that will face our next state legislature is that of the environment. Our state needs to decide if we will allow mining that could ruin land and water for a thousand years; we need to decide if we will get serious about PFAS, clean air, rivers and lakes.*

*WISDOM's work for environmental justice has centered on **the "Rights of Nature."** In the Rights of Nature movement, we **recognize that nature - water, land, animals - has a right to exist and to be healthy. The natural world does not exist solely to be exploited for economic gain. Humanity is part of the natural world, not its owner.** The concept is simple, but the implications are enormous.*

***You are invited to participate in a webinar on June 5 (6pm CT), called "What's New in Rights of Nature?" You can learn about the surprising progress that has been made here in Wisconsin, and around the world. More importantly, you can learn more about what kinds of commitments we need from those who want to represent us in Madison next year. You can register for the webinar here.***

*In less than 2 weeks, candidates for State Senate and State Assembly will need to have submitted their papers to appear on the ballot. These next few months will be an important time. Because we finally have fair maps, we expect there to be many more competitive races, both in the August 13 Primary Election, and in November. **This is the time when we need to be finding out where the candidates stand on matters like Rights of Nature, criminal legal system reform, the rights of immigrants, health care, housing and more.***

***WISDOM and WISDOM Action Network are committed to helping us all understand the issues. We call upon everyone to help ensure that candidates pay attention, and that we support the people who support a justice agenda.***

## SUMMER PATIO DISCUSSIONS: NATIVE AMERICAN PEOPLES

Over the past several years in our social justice studies, we have been viewing documentaries and reading about embracing the truth of our nation's history regarding issues like slavery, indigenous people, and the environment. The authors of these resources are modern-day prophets calling us into account. They are telling us true stories about our nation's history and warning us that our democracy is damaged and needs repair.

The original "builders" of our nation who wrote the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution creating our democracy did a fine job of laying a foundation for our nation. But leaders then, and those more recently, were far from perfect in implementing the meanings of those words — sometimes naively and unintentionally, sometimes intentionally for political purposes behind the scenes.

Our "democracy/home" is now nearly 250 years old, and we are suffering the consequences of long-deferred maintenance and updates. In recent years, we have been hit by all of the world's problems, all at once, all of the time. These include racism, immigration, wars, global warming, the plight of indigenous peoples, fires and floods, gun violence, and other man-made and natural disasters.

Every day brings us some other exhausting problem to deal with. Although WE did not create the problems resulting from the mistreatment of the land and the people who have lived here, we must acknowledge and repair the damage if our nation is to move forward.

Learning this history takes time because we are discovering new information and unlearning past misunderstandings. Our most current next step on that journey here at Monona UMC will be discussion sessions this summer, to revisit some of our studies earlier this spring of First Nation Peoples. Together, little by little, we can gain a deeper understanding of this specific issue and determine steps to take to make changes in how we can address these injustices in the future.
